



JOHN GOLDMAN ABSTRACT PRIZE

Early career researchers, trainees, students, and practitioners working in the field of transplantation and cellular therapy

Submit your abstract to the BSBMTCT Scientific Meeting to be considered for the **John Goldman Abstract Prize**.

Abstracts in clinical research or basic science including those already submitted to EBMT are welcome. Recipients of BSBMTCT grants to attend EBMT will be expected to submit their abstracts. Shortlisted candidates will give a 10-minute in person presentation at the BSBMTCT Scientific Day on Wednesday 6th May 2026.

Two John Goldman Abstract Prizes of £500 each will be selected from the shortlist, one in clinical research and one in basic science. The competition is a great opportunity to present your findings to an expert audience and enhance your CV.

Your abstract may relate to any scientific or clinical study in haematopoietic stem cell transplantation and cellular therapy. Please include a title, names and affiliations of authors, and your contact email address and telephone number. The body of the abstract should be no more than 300 words long. You must have made a significant contribution to the work and have the agreement of your co-authors to present. The content of unpublished work will be respected as for a closed scientific session.
